## Florida Folk Show at Everglades City & More!

11/4: On November 4th, Florida Folk Show will be live in Everglades City at the Rod and Reel Gun Club from 10AM-Noon for a fundraiser to help save the [Bank of The Everglades building](#), once the largest building in SW Florida. Built in 1925, finished in 1927, and utilized until 1962 as a bank, and then revitalized later as a B&B, the [Everglades Society for Historic Preservation](#) came into possession of the building in 2021 after it was damaged by a hurricane. The [Everglades Society for Historic Preservation](#) has begun work to raise funds for preservation and renovation.

Musical guests will include [Sarah McCulloch](#) and [Raiford Starke](#), just back from recording Sarah's new album, and [Charlie Pace](#), an excellent local Everglades City-born-and-raised singer songwriter.

11/8: On November 8, Florida Folk Nights returns with The Florida Boys and [Reverend Billy C. Wirtz](#) at [The Study Lounge](#) located at 3100 3rd Ave N., in St. Petersburg, FL, from 6-8PM.

11/11: On November 11, Florida Folk Show will be back at the [Craftsman House Gallery](#) located at 2955 Central Ave N. in St. Petersburg, FL. This special broadcast will feature three expert guests who will speak on environmental issues in Florida:

*1. Richard Radigan, who is directing an amazing program with [Tampa Bay Watch](#) that collects oyster and clam shells from local restaurants around Tampa Bay area for use in building coral reefs around the Tampa Bay area. The program is in operation now in the Tierre Verde area and several growing reefs are at work now cleaning the water. Eleven restaurants save their oyster shells instead of throwing them out. [Tampa Bay Watch](#) collects them weekly and transports them to the growing sites. Radigan and [Tampa Bay](#)*

Watch hope the publicity we give them will result in more restaurants signing up for this extremely worthwhile project.

2. Maureen Vicaria, Program and Partner Manager for the [Florida Wildlife Corridor Foundation](#), now with a headquarters in St. Petersburg, will announce a film broadcast outside the Corridor's new "digs" in the St. Pete Warehouse district, at Wild Space Gallery, located at 2606 Fairfield Ave S., BLDG #7. Called "O2: Path to Connection," it is another fabulous film detailing other aspects of the Florida Wildlife Corridor.

3. Ragan Whitlock, attorney for the National Regional Office for the [Center for Biological Diversity](#), located in St. Pete, will visit us with the latest information regarding the federal government's ongoing efforts to put the endangered manatee back on the endangered species list, where it should have never been removed from in 2017. -Pete Gallagher

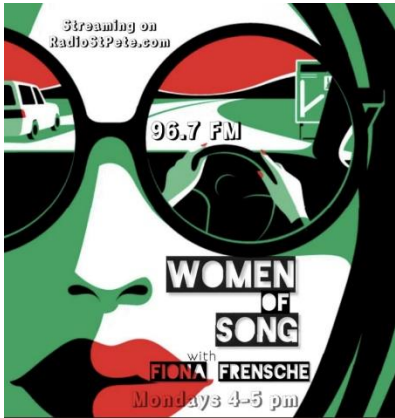
## Heritage Village, Historic House Concert

## Timothy Valle: Sound Guy Extraordinaire

**Florida Folk Show live on Saturdays 10AM-12PM/Noon**

**Q:** When you work on Florida Folk Show, both on the air and off the air, what inspires you?

*Tim: For the music side of things, I am most inspired by the amazing talent of the musicians and songwriters that we feature on the show. It really motivates me to get better at my sound work so the audience can hear how truly amazing these folks are. In addition to the live music, most weeks we try to have a guest on the show to discuss a current environmental issue. They really inspire me to stay focused on and dedicated to fighting to preserve and protect the Florida that we have left. It's amazing how many different individuals and organizations there are in the Tampa Bay area working hard to*



*protect the wildlife and natural areas that make our home such a unique and beautiful place to live.*

Q: What are your favorite parts of being a sound guy and co-host on RadioStPete?

*Tim: I love that I get to run sound for some of my favorite musicians and songwriters, folks that I've been a fan of for years. I can't emphasize enough how much amazing talent there is in the area. It's kind of crazy to me that they come down early on Saturday mornings, often after playing a gig the night before, to play some songs for us. I am truly honored and humbled to get to be a part of RadioStPete and the Florida Folk Show family.*

Q: What wisdom do you have to pass on to other or future members of the RadioStPete team?

*Tim: Have fun. Doing live radio can be a stressful experience at times. Things will inevitably go disastrously wrong. But somehow through all the chaos we make it happen. It's not always perfect, or the way we planned (assuming we had a plan in the first place), but it's always an exciting adventure so try to enjoy it and have as much fun as you can.*

Q: What do you want to see RadioStPete do in future? Florida Folk Show do in future?

*Tim: I want to see RadioStPete continue to grow into the role of community radio. St. Pete is in a constant state of change, that only seems to be accelerating. As the city continues to grow and evolve, I hope we can maintain the unique arts and music scene (and the supportive community that surrounds it) which has drawn so many new residents to our city. I see RadioStPete as an integral part of maintaining that sense of community. For the Florida Folk Show, I simply want to see it continue forever. As long as there is a Florida, there is a need for the Florida Folk Show.*

*To me, the Florida Folk Show represents this beautiful tapestry of Florida's past, present and future. It's a reminder of our shared history as Floridians. It's a celebration of the music, people and places that have made Florida what it is today. It's hope that we will still have a Florida to call home years down the road. I hope the Florida Folk Show continues to inspire people to write songs about Florida, to fight for our environment, and to preserve our unique culture for generations to come.*
